

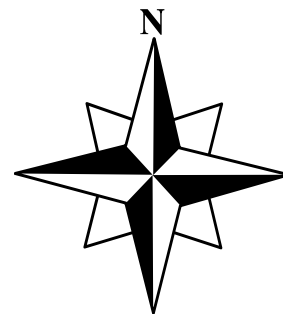

Mid Columbian Year Update

The end of January marks the midpoint of the Columbian year and as I sit here pulling together our Annual Survey of Fraternal Activities, I'm amazed at all that this council has accomplished so far this year. Though the hard work of our council members we have continued to proudly support those historical activities that have served Trinity Council so well and have initiated some new activities to provide for growth in the future. Critical to this growth are ongoing efforts to recruit and retain members. Although we lost a number of dearly loved members into the Loving Arms of our Lord early this Columbian year, our membership continues to grow. Under the excellent membership recruitment skills of Deputy Grand Knight Joe Kozelsky, we are once again on pace for a banner membership year. As a council we have also taken new initiatives to help our new members feel welcome and enable us to become "the most welcoming council in the Finger Lakes Chapter."

As was a founding principle of our order, we have continued our proud tradition of supporting the families of our members. Through our attendance at wakes and funerals, our Deceased Members Mass and Breakfast in November and poinsettia delivery program at Christmas, our council continues to provide spiritual and moral support to the families of our departed brothers. Through the efforts of some very special Brother Knights, who visit our sick, send gift baskets on our behalf, and keep our Prayer Chain up to date, we provide physi-

cal and spiritual support to those in need. Through our Blood Drive in December we collected 75 pints of blood for the sick of our larger community.

We have supported our youth through both financial and "labor of love" donations to local Cub and Boy Scout groups, through sponsorship of a Webster baseball team and our very successful annual Free Throw Competition. In addition, we have provided support to the youth of our parishes by making donations in support of those who attended the National Catholic Youth Convention in Ohio last fall.

The physically and mentally disabled of our community have also been assisted through the loving work done by our Brother Knights who work with the Pierce Street group home residents, and those all involved with the Finger Lakes Developmental Disabilities Services parties. Critical to the success of these activities is the support our members provide to our annual C & B drive. This year's sale of 500 books is a testament of our council's commitment to those facing physical and mental challenges in our area.

Through our member involvement, and financial support of organizations such as Hope House at Holy Trinity and the Christmas Sharing Program at St. Mary's of the Lake as well as Sister Karlien at the Mt. Carmel Food Cupboard in Rochester, we continue to provide for the physical needs of those in our communities.

As a Catholic based organization we have a responsibility to support life at all

This year, thanks to some members who are actively involved in the Pro-Life activities outside the K of C, the council has once again brought to the forefront important topics such as Stem Cell Research and the Rights of the Unborn. By providing a forum for the presentation of information on these important topics, and financial support for organizations such as Birthright of Ontario, we have begun to make the turn from 'talking the talk' to "walking the walk" related to these issues. I look forward to continued discussions and actions related to Pro-Life activities as the year goes on

Although my goal of creating a better link between Trinity Council and our parishes has not progressed to the degree I would have liked due to time limitations on my part, our members continue to play active roles in their parishes and are the true ambassadors for our council. Although there is still work to be done in this area, we must be doing something right. Since the beginning of the Columbian year four of our clergy, Fr Symon, Deacons Jim Nail, Jerry Skerrett and Mark Robins have joined our Order, It is wonderful to see our clergy wanting to be involved in our work.

We are truly a Charity centered council that is solid grounded upon on 50 years of Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism.

1This year we moved the Charity Ball to April 12th to enable us to update databases to reflect present day Webster and Ontario businesses. We mailed out ad requests to 378 businesses this year compared to 160 in 2006. We are pleased to welcome our new neighbors to participate in this great event. We are optimistic that we can increase the financial support we give and forge new relationships for future endeavors.

The recipient of this year's proceeds is "**Hope Hall.**"

Hope Hall provides an opportunity for "at risk" or 'educationally stranded" children to become successful lifelong learners. Serving students in grades 2 through 9 from

19 school districts in the Greater Rochester Area, Hope Hall's collaborative approach to learning connects faculty, staff and families as team members in a community of learning. "Hope" being a key word as it provides a supportive, multi-sensory education program to students who have experienced frustration and failure in traditional classroom environments. Hope Hall is the only school to offer the "Mastery in Learning Program" and teaches the full New York State curriculum.

Hope Hall, founded in 1994 through the vision of Sister Diana Dolce, SSJ. It is a private, non-denominational school, meaning it receives no financial support from any School District or the Diocese of Rochester. GK Dave and I toured the School several weeks ago. We both left very pleased that we can help this remarkable institution. What struck us both was the sense of dignity and respect that prevailed among the students and faculty. It was clear that the moral grounding that starts each day with a community meeting and lesson created an environment where students could safely push their abilities forward. It is a place where children get a second chance to discover themselves.

How can you help??

- Attend the Charity Ball on April 12th for an enjoyable evening. \$25/ person.

Abortion: New York State Has Gone Far Enough!

Governor Eliot Spitzer's Extreme Abortion Proposal, the so-called "Reproductive Health & Privacy Protection Act" or RHAPP, would:

- Promote late-term abortions of fully-formed infants
- Authorize non-physicians to perform abortions
- Lift the current age restriction on over-the-counter sales of the "morning-after pill"
- Thwart any efforts to involve parents in the abortion decisions of their children

In addition, it could:

- Compel all hospitals, including Catholic hospitals, to allow abortion

It could wipe out all the progress already made by pro-life advocates:

- The state's successful Prenatal Care Assistance Program for poor pregnant women could be forced to fund abortions, draining taxpayer dollars away from the care needed to produce healthy babies.
- The state's alternatives-to-abortion fund could be forced to cover abortions, decreasing the scarce dollars available to help mothers choose life for their infants.
- The state's civil rights laws protecting doctors and nurses who do not wish to be involved in abortion would be in serious jeopardy.

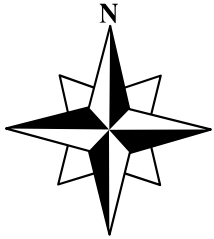
