

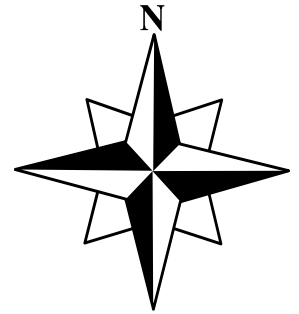

50TH ANNIVERSARY MASS AND MEMBERSHIP SUB-COMMITTEE REPORT: JOE KOZELSKY

We had our first meeting on February 6. It was decided that we would attempt to hold one major dedicated mass at each of the parishes during September, October and November of 2008, the purpose of which would be to celebrate our 50th anniversary and to promote the membership drive. To this end, we will try to have Knights and auxiliary members serve in as many capacities as possible such as lectors, readers, ushers Eucharistic ministers and so on. We will also develop special celebratory and recruiting materials and displays which will be passed from parish to parish for their celebrations and membership drives, and we will also try to have special pins and pens as give-aways. The masses will be scheduled first in September at St. Mary of the Lake, next at Holy Trinity, combined there with the mass for the Deceased, and on November 9 at St. Paul's; St. Rita's is to be determined. We will hold a membership drive after each mass as well as following the "major mass." We are also exploring having the color guard at the major mass and we will have a series of short publicity blurbs available for the bulletins for several weeks prior to the actual membership drive. Our next meeting is on April 7th.

GOLF SUB-COMMITTEE: JIM ROUSSEAU

The golf committee is planning the 50th Anniversary golf outing in late spring or early summer of 2009. We are considering a "warm up" tournament in the summer of 2008 in preparation for the big event the following year. Time and place are yet to be decided for either event. Dinner Meeting Reservation Policy

Brother Knights, over the past few years the number of members who come to our dinner meetings has been increasing at an exciting pace. Few councils repeatedly draw the number of men to their meetings as we do and it is wonderful to see so many of you attend both dinner and the council meeting. The interactions that take place during our social hour and dinner are critical to both the enjoyment of our members and the success that we achieve as a council. But with this success comes an issue that we must resolve in order to preserve the momentum we have achieved.

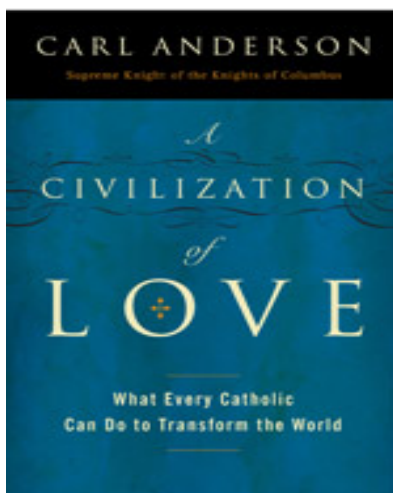
As has been highlighted in the Compass and in the reservation e-mails that our Lecturer Tom Hoffend has sent out, **it is the expectation of this council that a dinner reservation made is a dinner paid for.** In order to offer us dinners at a reasonable cost, we have agreement in place with our caterer to provide him with a head count on Tuesday morning of meeting week. This allows him to purchase the correct amount of food which minimizes his expenses. Once he has our count we are locked into paying for that number of dinners whether or not everyone attends. Doing anything less is not responsible on our part. **Reservations are necessary and we must fulfill our commitment to pay for what we ask to be prepared.** Although we have seen a slight increase in the number of members who, when absent, still pay their bill, this past month we once again had a large number of members (8) who made reservations and did not show. The officers of the council clearly recognize that emergencies and illness do come up between the time reservations are made and the dinner.

Under these circumstances, exceptions have and will be made on a case by case basis. We also appreciate the effort made by some to call and cancel at the last minute but as explained above, the council is still liable for the cost of the dinners. As a result, starting in April, Council Lecturer Tom Hoffend will be mailing out bills directly to any member who makes a reservation for themselves or their guest and does not show. If there are extenuating circumstances please contact him (585-872-5788) so they can be taken into consideration. Again the intention is not to punish anyone for those unexpected issues that arise as part of life, but instead to be fair to all by keeping prices reasonable and using our funds in the proper manor

As was stated in our opening remarks, dinner meetings are a critical component of our council and the last thing we want to do is deter anyone from attending but after repeated “soft” requests for taking responsibility for dinner reservations we feel we have no choice other than to start formally enforcing a policy that has been in place for many years. Hopefully those of you who routinely attend value these events and understand the purpose of my actions. This is not an issue with our caterer; it is an issue of fulfillment of a commitment. All we ask is that everyone honors the reservation policy so the council can use our funds in support of our charitable works instead of paying for dinners that are not eaten.

We thank you for your understanding and look forward to seeing you all at the next dinner and meeting.

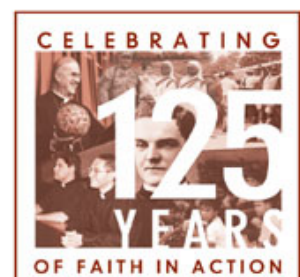

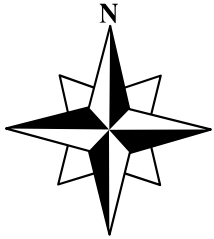
