

The 2008 Charity Ball was no different and is why membership involvement was at the top of our goal list. Under the outstanding leadership of Charity Ball Chairmen Tom O'Connell, this year we had a wonderful balance of both senior members who had helped in the past and numerous new members who stepped forward in an attempt to fill the gap created by the lost of our historical sales leader George Webster. They did very well and I'm sure George was smiling down upon us when we presented the check to Sister Diana. 


