

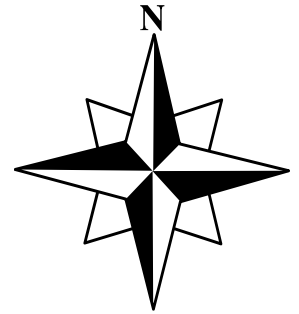

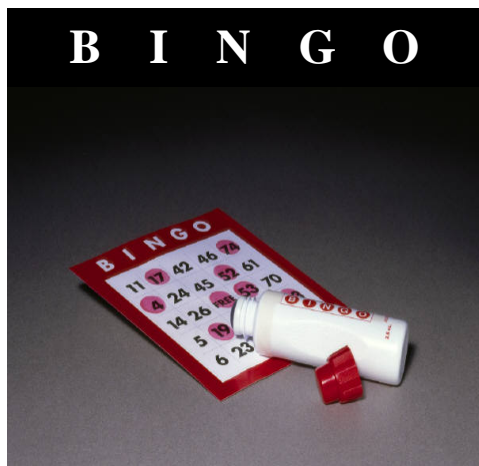

126th Supreme Convention



Knights Continue Building on Strengths, Successes

126th Supreme Convention draws thousands to Quebec City

The Knights of Columbus has the power to transform the world. That was the message Supreme Knight Carl A. Anderson delivered to more than 2,000 Knights of Columbus attending the 126th Supreme Convention in Quebec City, Que., Aug. 5-7. The theme of the annual meeting was “Building a Civilization of Love through Charity, Unity and Fraternity.”

Delegates and guests from each of the Order’s 70 jurisdictions were in attendance. For the first time in nearly 40 years, an official delegation of Knights from Cuba was on hand to take part in Supreme Council deliberations.

A STRONGER ORDER

In his annual report, Supreme Knight Anderson noted both the fraternal and business successes of the past year. Among the highlights were:

- Membership at an all-time high of 1,763,182. The 2007-08 fraternal year ended with a net gain of 21,894 members.
- 244 new councils chartered in the last fraternal year, bringing the total Orderwide to 13,485 councils.
- Columbian Squires membership grew to 28,961, and there are now 20,758 college Knights, an increase of 1,301 from last fraternal year.
- Total insurance in force in 2007 climbed past \$66 billion. The Order is ranked 967th on the

Fortune 1000 list of America’s largest corporations.

- Insurance sales in the last five years grew by more than 46 percent, while the industry as a whole grew only 8.6 percent during the same period.
- Top ratings from Standard & Poor’s (AAA) and the A. M. Best Co. (A++ Superior).
- More than \$14 billion in assets
- and \$7 million daily in investment capital.

“Unlike so many other companies, the Knights of Columbus is financially stronger today than it was one year ago,” Anderson told the convention attendees.

PAPAL VISIT POSITIONED KNIGHTS FOR GREATER GROWTH, SERVICE

The supreme knight told the convention that the pastoral trip of Pope Benedict XVI to the United States last April was an “enormous gift” to the Knights and the Church. Polls commissioned by the Knights following the pope’s visit showed that it made a deep impression on Catholics.

“Millions of Catholics are now more willing to live the Catholic life more actively,” Anderson said. “We must take advantage of the renewed interest in the Catholic faith that has burst forth because of his visit.”

Membership recruitment initiatives building on the visit are under

way. “It is vital that we bring these men into the Order as quickly as possible,” Anderson said. “Let us be co-workers in the renewal of the Church that our great pope is leading.”

In papal greetings to the convention, conveyed in a letter from Vatican Secretary of State Cardinal Tarcisio Bertone, the Knights were urged to strengthen the “bonds of faith and fraternity uniting the Knights throughout the world” in order to address the challenges facing the Church and society.

Cardinal Bertone said the pope deeply appreciates “the outstanding efforts which the Knights of Columbus are making to promote the catechetical and spiritual formation of Catholic men.”

“[Pope Benedict] is especially grateful for the tireless efforts of your Order to promote the culture of life, the defense of the family, and the encouragement of vocations to the priesthood and the consecrated life.”

The papal greetings included the pope’s apostolic blessing and a prayer that the “Order strives to fulfill its noble mission in the service of the Church” grounded in that “‘unity of vision and purpose’ inherited from the founder, the Venerable Michael McGivney.”

Kenneth A. Waehner Catholic Services Award *Joe Bradbury*

The Kenneth A. Waehner Catholic Services award is presented to a Knight who consistently demonstrates commitment and involvement to both church and our council.

This years' recipient is an honorary member of our Order, a member of the Rev Paul J. Cuddy 4th Degree Assembly and has been a member of the Knights of Columbus since the dawn of the Second Vatican Council in 1961. Since that time he has taken advantage of the opportunities that these changes in our church provided, by becoming engaged in his faith. He has been, and still is, very active in his parish, St Mary's of the Lake, where for many years he has served in numerous liturgical roles including lecture, Eucharistic Minister and Stephen Minister. Most impressively, he has consistently used and shared his God given musical talents as a Cantor and is a legendary member of our choir and folk group. He is a man of faith who, even when on retreat at Notre Dame Retreat House last year, couldn't say no to a priests request for musical accompaniment. Never a day of rest for those blessed with a beautiful voice.

On the council side has consistently helped with numerous actives especially this past year when he stepped up to help fill the void in our Charity Ball ad book sales team created when George Webster passed away a year ago. He routinely helps with parish C & B sales and most importantly this past year took on the job of rebuilding our council First Degree Team . Our recipient is a quiet man, who every few months hands me a hand written list of activities that have taken place, who attended and what they did. To many of us these are activities are things we take for granted, like trips to the movies, bowling outings, pizza and soda. Simple stuff, nothing special, but to the people he takes on these outings these simple activities they are much more than that. These are special outings, a time to get out of their special home and to see and do things that they would otherwise not be able to do. His guests, along with their caregivers are with us this evening, they are our friends from the Pierce Street Group Home. For many years now, this special Brother Knight has ensured that our Pierce Street friends have had the opportunity to experience these special outings on a regular basis. During the past year alone, he has coordinated over 10 different events in addition to our annual picnic and Christmas party. This is not a one time thing; he has done this for years, never once looking for recognition or reward.

In addition to all this he finds time to help our widows in numerous ways including helping them move or taking them to the store or to the doctors. He is a man of compassion who does what he does because it is the right thing to do.

In addition he has helped coordinate special outreach programs to help those in need. In 2006 at the special request of the Past Grand Knight, he revived our parade committee and for the

past 2 years has chaired this fun event which has done much to build camaraderie within the group of Knights who participate in this event.

He is constantly looks for ways to get the word out about the Knights and has coined a number of phrases including "The light of Christ Shines Brightly in the Knights" and "Making the world a better place one Knight at a Time." He is currently beginning his second year as a council officer and has stepped up and taken on responsibilities well above what is typically seen in new officers. 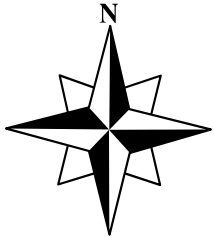
