

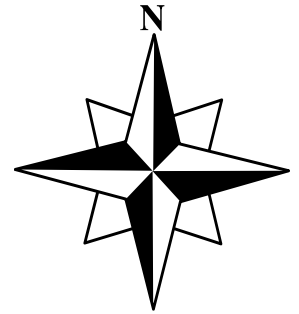

Grand Knight's Message

As our church year comes to a close, the readings at Mass focus on our obligation as Disciples of Christ to live out our lives in service to others. Each time I hear this message I am immediately reminded of my time in the 5th grade. You see, I was a child of the early post Vatican II days when there was much confusion about what should and should not be taught as part of religious formation programs in our Catholic schools. To many, the "new" church teaching was that God was all about love and no matter what you did or didn't do, God would forgive you and would allow you into his Heavenly home. This was a beautiful message for the youngest children in my school but I was now in 5th grade and the good Sister that taught my class was much more reluctant to jump on board with this concept of "love without responsibly". Sister Bernard was a strong willed sister who found ways to sneak in teaching the "old" while giving the impression she had accepted the new. She relied heavily on the Baltimore Catechism and reminded us daily of the Beatitudes and how it was our responsibility to help those who were hungry, naked and physically and mentally ill. Although I was too young to understand at the time, I believe she felt that as 5th graders we were old enough to start taking responsibility for our actions and living up to what God called us to do.

Now as an adult I think Sister had it right, God's love, while uncondi-

tional, is a two way street that calls us to show our love for Him by taking care of those in need. As Knights, we are called by the first principle of our Order "Charity" to assist the widow, the down-trodden and all those in need. As a council we do these things in some wonderful ways. Through our Deceased Members Mass and poinsettia delivery program we support our widows, though the Hill Haven Mass program we keep the light of Christ in the lives of the aging. Through our support of the mentally disabled at the Pierce Street home and our FLLDSO parties, we bring some joy to those in need of special help. Our donations to Hope House and other organizations that service the poor, allow us to feed the hungry and clothe the naked. The list goes on and on. We do so much and could do so much more if **everyone** volunteered to help. If you are already "involved" in council activities thank you for all you have done. If not, please step up and answer God's call to serve others. Lord knows, with the way the economy is going, the number of people in need is likely to grow in leaps and bounds. Now is the time and Trinity Council is the place to get involved. Our project chairmen have been specifically asked to recruit new members on to their event teams. So if you get a call, please consider donating a few hours to one of our worthwhile projects and show God your love for Him through service to others.

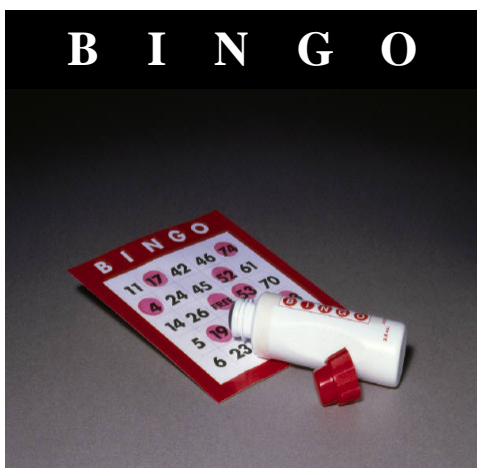

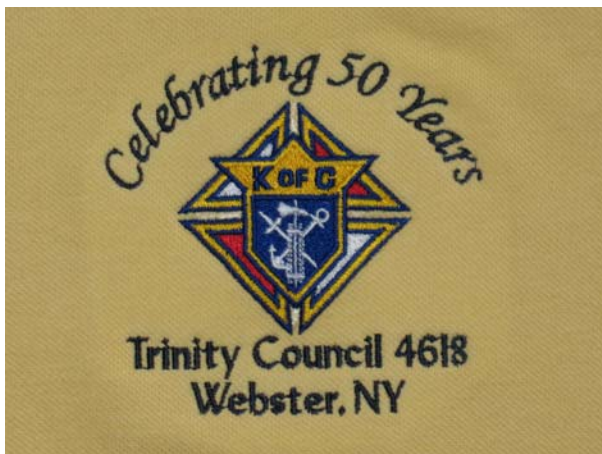

How Trinity Council No. 4618 Got Started

Editor's Note: As we celebrate our 50th Anniversary, Historical Committee Chairman, Tom Freundsuh, is submitting articles that provide our readership with important facts of our history. Obviously, Jim and Florence Stein played the most important role, getting Trinity Council started.

As I remember, Trinity Council started off in very quiet manner. One noon early in 1958, my husband Jim came into the house for lunch whistling one of his favorite tunes. He mentioned he had some unexpected company that morning: Cliff Joslin, who was the District Deputy for the Knights of Columbus in this area, and Clifford Sargent, the KofC Insurance Representative; they and Jim were members of the St. John Fisher Council. They explained that the District felt that a new Council should be organized in the Webster area. This would include men from the three parishes: Holy Trinity, Saint Rita and Saint Mary of the Lake. They asked him to help spread the word around for new candidates. I remember asking, "Why you?" They felt he knew more people in the area than anyone else who would be willing to help.

Jim first approached the Pastors of these parishes with a personal visit. A telephone call was too easy to forget, but with a face-to-face visit he was always sure if he had their help. He would talk until he had either a "yes" or "no" and then would work on from that point. The Pastors were asked to announce that anyone interested in the Knights of Columbus were to contact Jim. This was different from the procedure in the early 1900's, when one had to be invited into the Order, then

voted upon. The members in those early days were mostly professionals and business people.

A month later, Jim called me one afternoon about four o'clock, and said he was having a meeting in our home that night and would I care to bake a cake. I answered "No, I was getting dinner ready." Jim of course was not heard of hearing; he just went on as if I agreed. He continued "I think a chocolate cake would be very nice." Of course, in those days I do not think we had cake mixes. So that night I was still frosting the cake when the men began to arrive in my kitchen. We did have a front door; but it was a waste of money because no one ever used it; it was much easier to come into the kitchen right from the driveway. Well, these are the men I remember at the first meeting: Dick Costello, Larry Synder, Les Miner, Dan Tobin, Tom Seward, Joe Ruelbach and James Clark from Ontario. Our son Bob may have been there too, but this was before he was married and he was always in and out so much I guess I never noticed. I am sure that there were a few others whose names I do not remember.

Cliff Joslin returned several times to see Jim; if he did not find him at the police station, he just came over to the house. As the number of men increased, they stated to have their meetings either at St. Rita's barn or Holy Trinity Hall. But their continued to be meetings at the house. In July of 1958, they decided there were enough men to have a First Degree. The Degree Team was from St. John Fisher Council. The ceremony took place at St. Rita's barn; Tom Seward's wife helped me to put together some refreshments. At the same time, the men held their first election and installation of officers. Jim was asked to be the Grand Knight. He

agreed but only for one year, as he was already an officer in the Rochester Fourth Degree....in fact the first member of any Council other than the Rochester Council to hold office in the Fourth Degree Assembly. The other Trinity Council Officers were Dick Costello (Deputy Grand Knight), Thomas Seward (Chancellor), Les Miner (Financial Secretary), Bob Stein (Treasurer); I do not remember the other officers of that time. They also voted on a name that same day, and decided to call their new Council, "Trinity Council", in honor of the Blessed Trinity, as their were three parishes involved. At first, there was a little criticism since some people thought that the Council had been for Holy Trinity Church, without realizing that no Council was named for a specific Church, but rather for some saint, bishop or well known priest. The new Council had really been named for THREE PERSONS: As the years have passed and the organization has done so many wonderful things (and is still doing them), I often think this is due to the name the men chose. No one can go higher than the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit for guidance in ministering to the needs of others.

Editor's Note. Our Council historian was able to provide the remaining list of Charter Officers of Trinity Council: Richard Metzinger (Warden), Andrew Gutacker (Advocate), James Hayslip (Inside Guard), Anthony Grabowski (Outside Guard), James Mann (Recorder), James Clark (Lecturer), Joseph Mayer, Joseph Ruelbach and Hugh Mc Rae (Trustees). Trinity Council had it's Charter Night Dinner, November 19th, 1958 at Holy Trinity Hall, Webster.
