

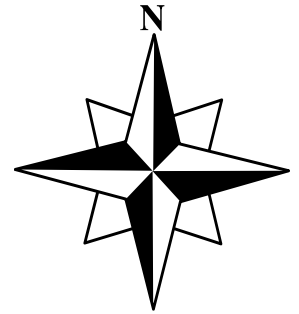

Father Jacob Konath, a Priest from India who is on a 6 months visit to the USA and has spent a month at The Church of the Most Holy Trinity in Webster and is currently spending time at a Church in Chili will leave the USA at the end of July. He was invited to dinner and spoke at the April meeting of Trinity Council.



Father Jacob is a parish priest. He told us of his many experiences with Sister Theresa, including how awed he was when she asked him to hear her confession. But the main reason he came to the United States was to get financial aid to help him care for the 64 children he was asked to care for who were made orphans by the 2004 tsunami that

struck parts of India. These children were 3 to 6 years old at that time. They now go to a Catholic school

where tuition is \$460.00 a year.. He has started the Christ the King Educational Charity to raise money for this purpose

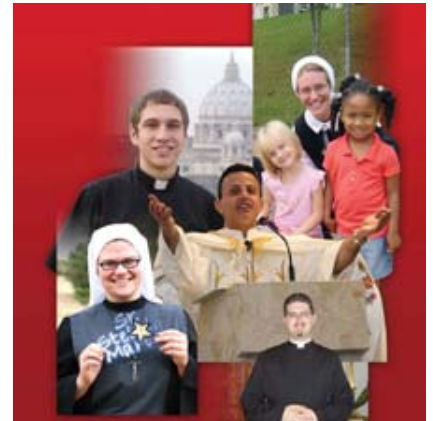

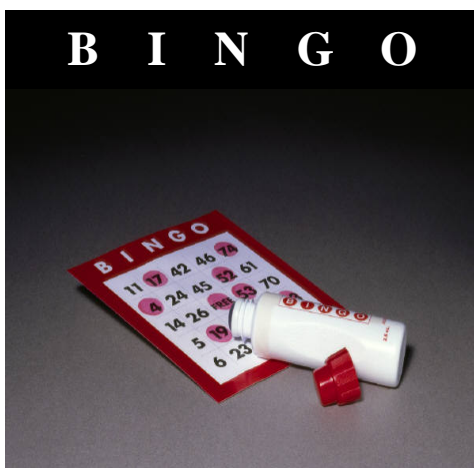
### World Day of Prayer for Vocations

## “Run, Walk or Sit” fundraiser

Register now for the first “Run, Walk or Sit” fundraiser for Trinity Council 4618. Parts of this write-up will be familiar, because some of what we wrote last month is still relevant and, therefore, some of those words still fit. As we have said before, this was originally conceived as a 5K road race event, but query of council members earlier clearly indicated that while many wished to support it, not many really wanted to run. Imagine that!

Then we thought about a Run and Walk event, but soon realized that many brothers really did not want to walk either, so we thought up the idea of sitting which appears to have been a great idea. This is because members can sit at the center during the event, or sit in the comfort of their own home and wait to be updated about the results at their convenience (should actually they care about the results). Although we would prefer that you were with us, we don't care where you sit as long as you register and send in your \$15.00 registration fee. If you would rather sit at home and cheer us on, or not - that's OK.

We will start at the center and end at the center – we have found a good 5K (3.1) mile route from the K of C: down Jackson Road to State Road to Iroquois Street, through the park and back; and a 3.0 mile walking route to and around North Ponds park and back. As we said earlier, the sitting “route” is expected to be considerably less complicated. Sitters: keep training now and get your “whatevers” in shape.

We now have decided to have official timing and are in the process of making arrangements. There will be multiple age categories and we **will** have accurate times. There will be recognition of place by gender and by age. This is by invitation and everyone is invited, so please invite anyone you want who you would think would support our cause. They just need to understand that the funds raised are for our council and NOT for charity. Register now and give us a head start on our event!

**The Most Important Person on Earth** by *Joseph Cardinal Mindszenty*

The most important person on earth is a mother. She cannot claim the honor of having built Notre Dame Cathedral. She need not. She has built something more magnificent than any Cathedral—a dwelling for an immortal soul, the tiny perfection of her baby's body.

The angels have not been blessed with such a grace. They cannot share in God's creative miracle to bring new saints to Heaven. Only a human mother can. Mothers are closer to God the Creator than any other creatures. God joins forces with mothers in performing this act of creation.

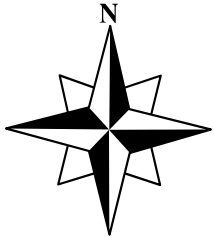
