

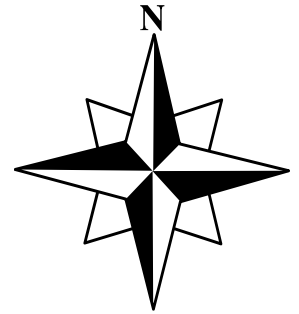

## Grand Knight's Message Trinity Council 4618: A Council Very Well Turned Out

In my first GK message I discussed some of the history of this outstanding Trinity Council 4618, and in doing so mentioned that I like numbers. Numbers can tell us a much about ourselves and provide an idea of who we are and what we have done.

During Columbian Year 2009 – 2010 Trinity Council 4618 was involved in a lot of activities and a lot of council members participated in those activities. I have tried to keep track of the number of members who devoted time and energy to our council.

Keeping track of this data is elusive. The source is taken from the signup sheets sent around at each general meeting. Some projects were done without a signup sheet. As such, an unknown number of people who worked on projects or activities are not accounted for. It is possible this could be a significant number. Additionally, I have data only for the number of people who volunteered for a task or project and not the number of "participations" they actually spent on that task or project. For example Brother Knight Chris Joy chaired the North Ponds Park Cleanup Project and worked it each month but I don't have the total number of times he actually participated on the project, and so the

totals captured here may be a gross under representation of our actual activity level. Nor does it account for the "administrative time" that Chris spent on the project.

Given these major limitations here is what I have.

We had signup sheets for 39 activities ranging from the monthly euchre tournaments, through poinsettia delivery through the annual charity dinner and the grounds maintenance crew for the Columbus Center. There are three more activities in which some or all of the officers participate so that makes a total of 42 known and identified different activities - in addition to Bingo and Bell Jar. There were at least 71 different individuals who signed up for at least one activity and several took part in 10 or more activities exclusive of Bingo and Bell Jar. One individual, PGK Don Bell, took part in at least 21 different events – activities – meeting groups! And this does not include his participation on the WCC board or related activities. No one else came even anywhere close although several individuals signed up for 10 or more different activities.

Of course the biggest activity items are Bingo and Bell Jar and Mass at Hill Haven. I did not think to contact our these chairmen for an estimation of the number of Knights that worked on their teams before the writing of this column.

What is the total number of member signups then, exclusive of Bingo and Bell Jar and Mass at Hill Haven for 2009 - 2010? 270. As has been mentioned, many of these sign-ups resulted in more than one participation with a few as many as five or more. Assuming an average of two participations per project brings us to 540 member participations. Additionally we have Bingo almost every week and at each event at least six members participate. This could amount to an estimated 300 or more member "participations" per year! As such, we might be able to conservatively estimate approximately 1,000 member Knight participations during Columbian Year 2009 – 2010 for Trinity Council 4618.

And this might be an underestimation of the actual number of participations when it is realized that this does not account for the number of "participations" by individuals such as our newsletter editor(s) and others who have not signed up for their roles but have volunteered to take them on. We know that there are other activities which have not been captured by the signup sheets such as the food cupboard projects, so it would appear that a conservative of 1,000 participations this year seems reasonable; and that does not include the participations by our auxiliary.

Thanks to one and all for all that you do. We are indeed a council very well turned out.

## Knights of Columbus and the KKK

Council brother Robert Leschhorn brought this to my attention.

According to an article by Amy Godine, in the August, 2004 issue of Adirondack Life, during the 1920s there was an attempt to establish KKK clans in the Adirondacks and elsewhere in New York. As always, the prospective Klan organizers focused their hatred on Jews and Catholics as well as black people. Al Smith, proud Irish Catholic, was governor then and running for president. There were claims by the KKK that if Smith were elected, the Pope would become the unofficial president of the United States. The KKK wanted to subvert his election and tried to initiate chapters throughout the area including Glens Falls.

According to Godine, during 1924, the Klan raised a burning cross on Denny Lynch's hill in Saratoga, overlooking an Irish neighborhood, held another cross burning in Hadley and distributed pamphlets throughout the area. In October, the clan organizer tried to raise a chapter in Glens Falls where "there was a bloody run-in

with K of C members" which ended that effort. Another Klan rally in South Glens Falls was also challenged and disrupted when a number of Catholic buddies went to the rally and pushed over an outhouse which the KKK leader was occupying at the moment, and that was the end of that. I don't know if they were K of C members or not, but I like to think that they were.

In another interesting story, the Klan tried to organize a chapter in Barneveld and had targeted a Catholic man name Mike Coleman, who they said was ripe for being tarred and feathered. They were becoming successful in establishing themselves and a meeting was held in which those in attendance wore their robes and hoods. Buck Stockhauser, a local resident who was fed up with things, broke into the meeting, took out his pistol and told them he would shoot anyone who refused to take off their hoods and identify themselves. That broke up the meeting, and the chapter, and the leader disappeared and so did the dues.

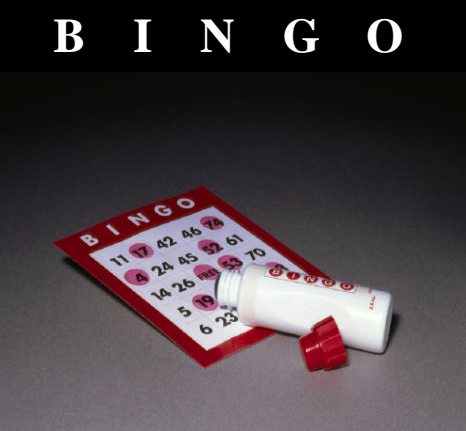

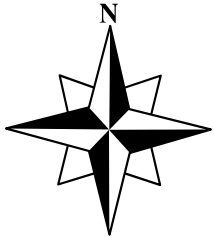
