

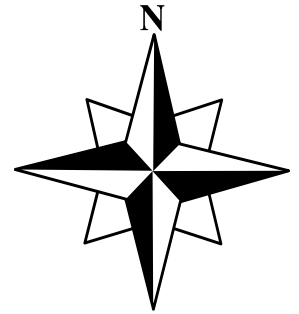

Grand Knight's Message

We Enter a New Decade

First, let me wish everyone a happy and healthy new year. Second, in the role of Chairman of the Board of the WCC, I regret to announce that citing family reasons, Dean Hamingson has resigned his position as President of WCC. Dan Milner has agreed to step in and fill that role and we are pleased and fortunate that he has. Third, it is time to reflect and plan.

Things can and do change a lot in 10 years. Having nothing to do with K of C, but because it is interesting to recognize and emblematic of how things change, do you realize that in 2000: Google did not exist, making its first appearance only six years ago in 2004; Facebook, YouTube, MySpace and Twitter did not exist; it was not generally envisioned that we would have a black president; few people knew of Sarah Palin; the Office of Homeland Security did not exist; there was only a hint that the climate was changing; flat screen television did not exist; and people actually had to stop and ask for directions?

Yet, in some ways the world has not changed at all and many of our everyday issues remain. The advent of a new decade provides us an opportunity to re-dedicate ourselves to the improvement of those things which are within in our power to improve. In this vein, and given our rich history and incredibly strong base

as an organization I envision three primary goal areas for the immediate future. They are financial, membership/fraternal and the financial restructure of WCC.

First, in the financial area, both the WCC and K of C have, and have had a complexity of various fundraising, operational and special accounts. It is important that we continue to move forward with the work that was started under the previous GK and I am dedicated to doing so.

Second, in the membership/fraternal area, although our council has seen many new members join during the last few years we need to refine our membership/recruitment procedures, and focus on retention of new members. We will rely heavily on the work and ideas brought forth by Jerry Ryan and his committees for this endeavor.

Third, in relation to the WCC, we need to carry on the excellent work started by Dean Hamingson and the succession committee. One their goals was to make the WCC financially self supporting and financially contributory to the council and the community at large. Hopefully we will be able to bring this goal closer to fruition along with many of the others the committee envisioned.

Please join us in pursuit of these goals and help make 2010 and the next decade yet another special period in the history of the K of C and our WCC.

HAM & CHEESE BRUNCH CASSEROLE

16 slices white bread, somewhat stale

- 1 lb. ham
- 3/4 lb. sharp cheddar cheese
- 1/2 lb. swiss cheese
- 3 cups milk
- 8 large eggs
- 1/2 tsp. onion salt
- 1/2 tsp. dry mustard

TOPPING

- 3 cups crushed corn flakes
- 1/2 cup margarine

Cut bread, ham and cheese into cubes.

Arrange 1/3 of bread in greased 9 x 13 baking dish.

Add half of ham and cheese cubes.

Repeat first 2 steps and top with remaining 1/3 bread.

Beat eggs, add milk & seasonings. Pour over dish, cover and refrigerate overnight.

Before baking, combine corn flakes and melted margarine, sprinkle over top.

Bake at 375 for 40 minutes uncovered or until golden & puffy and knife inserted in center comes out clean.

Donation to Webster Public Library *Ron McNinch*

On October 26th, 2009 I had the fortunate pleasure of presenting a \$100.00 donation check to Terri Bennett, Director of Webster Public Library. This check was used to increase the population of books in the library with Catholic influence. This donation has occurred annually since 2006.

Below is a summary of books purchased for 2009 with the donation:

***Called to Love: Approaching John Paul II's Theology of the Body* by [Carl Anderson](#), [Jose Granados](#)**

Called to Love is by the bestselling author of *A Civilization of Love*. Carl Anderson with the help of Father José Granados. Together they have created a thoughtful and accessible work on the beauty of love and the splendor of the body inspired by the works and writings of Pope John Paul II.

As they explain, the body speaks of God, it reveals His goodness, and it also speaks of men and women and their vocation to love. *Called to Love* brings to life the tremendous gift John Paul II bestowed on humanity and gives readers a new understanding of the Christian way of love and how to embrace it fully in their lives.

***The Way of Love: Reflections on Pope Benedict XVI's Encyclical, Deus Caritas Est* by [Livio Melina](#) (Editor), [Carl A. Anderson](#) (Editor)**

In response to Benedict XVI's first encyclical, the Pontifical John Paul II Institute for Studies and Marriage and Family reflects, together with the Holy Father, on love. From the very beginning, the fundamental work of the Institute has been pursuing a deeper understanding of God's plan for marriage and family. In these

twenty-five years various generations of students and professors, following the legacy of John Paul II, have been able to discover and communicate the beauty of the vocation for which all men have been created: the call to love. Twenty-six professors from the Institute's various sessions express what in their understanding are the main themes of the document, approaching the topics raised by the Holy Father with different theological and philosophical perspectives; by so doing they have highlighted the significance and fecundity of the lines of thought suggested by the Pope. This book is offered as a path towards a fuller understanding the profundity and richness of the love with which God fills us and wants us to communicate in our turn.

***Angels of God: The Bible, the Church and the Heavenly Hosts* By [Mike Aquilina](#)**

Author and radio host Mike Aquilina introduces *Angels of God* with his own story of overcoming reluctance to fully accept angels in his spiritual life. After years of holding "remote reservations" on the topic, he saw the role of angels in the "tremendous spiritual struggle" of two friends facing imminent death from cancer. As they drifted in and out of consciousness "invocations of the angels, especially Saint Michael, came more frequently to their lips," he writes. "It became clear to me. that the angels are indeed fighting beside us in these battles." That realization led to an understanding of the role of angels in every phase of life. We are the "spoils of war" in the struggle between good and evil forces. "For us to ignore the angels would be a sign not only of disordered pride, but of colossal stupidity."

***The Making of A Catholic President: Kennedy vs. Nixon 1960* by [Shaun Casey](#)**

The 1960 presidential election, won ultimately by John F. Kennedy, was one of the closest and most contentious in American history. The country had

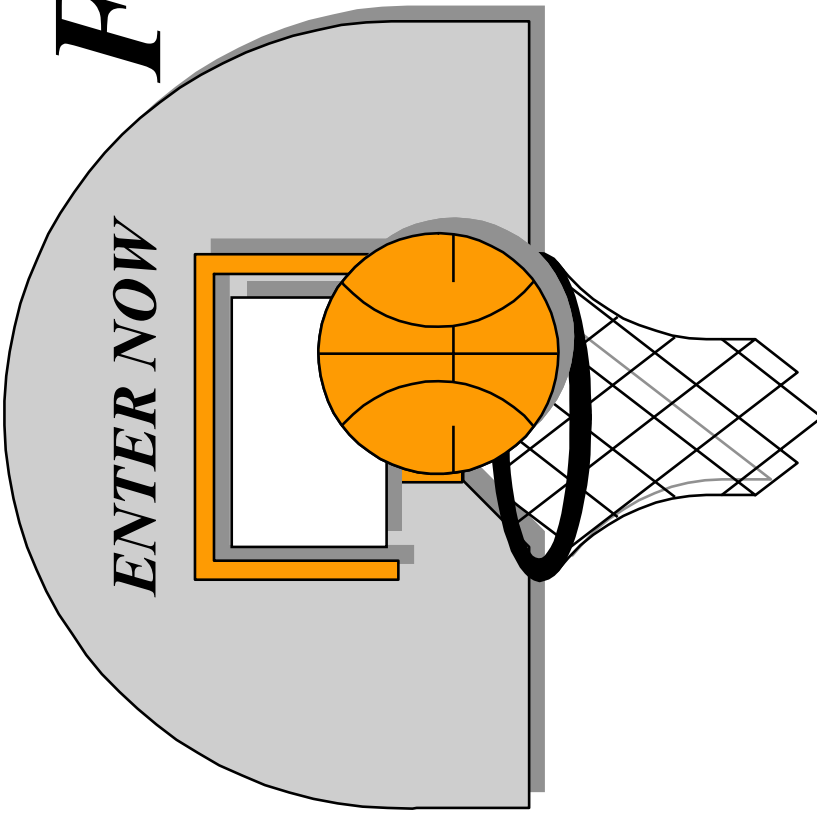
never elected a Roman Catholic president, and the last time a Catholic had been nominated—New York Governor Al Smith in 1928—he was routed in the general election. From the outset, Kennedy saw the religion issue as the single most important obstacle on his road to the White House. He was acutely aware of, and deeply frustrated by, the possibility that his personal religious beliefs could keep him out of the White House.

In *The Making of a Catholic President*, Shaun Casey tells the fascinating story of how the Kennedy campaign transformed the "religion question" from a liability into an asset, making him the first (and still only) Catholic president. Drawing on extensive archival research, including many never-before-seen documents, Casey takes us inside the campaign to show Kennedy's chief advisors—Ted Sorensen, John Kenneth Galbraith, Archibald Cox—grappling with the staunch opposition to the candidate's Catholicism. Casey also reveals, for the first time, many of the Nixon campaign's efforts to tap in to anti-Catholic sentiment, with the aid of Billy Graham and the National Association of Evangelicals, among others. 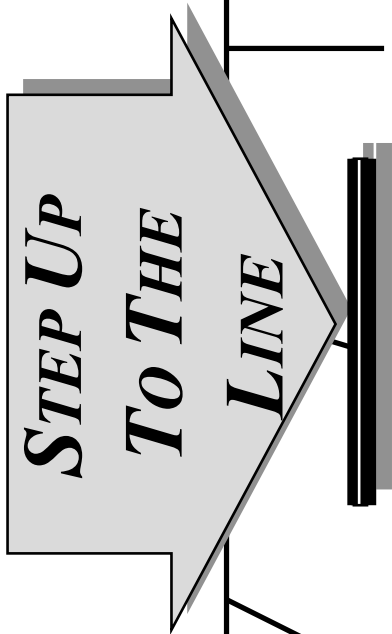

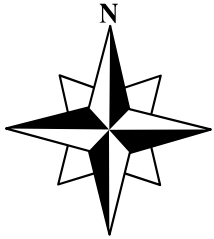
