

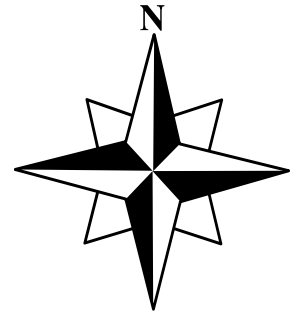

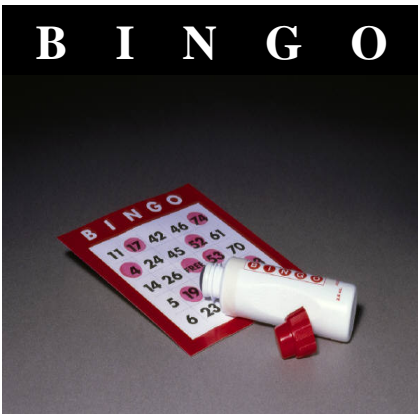

Donation to The Webster Public Library

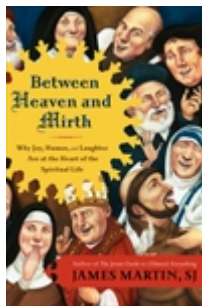

WHAT GOOD WE CAN DO: THE LESSON OF THE 2011 PASTA DINNER

A new Trinity Council member who pays any attention at all to the goings-on of the Council realizes in short order how much good can be accomplished when many pitch in to help. And when the Council joins with other groups in furtherance of a common cause, well, the sky's the limit.

At the Pasta Dinner Committee's first meeting on September 29th it became apparent that the Knights of Trinity Council were not the only ones concerned about the plight of 11 year-old Simon Harris. His battle with cancer had been a constant focus of the Council's prayers since we learned of it from his Grandfather, PGK Don Bell. Offers of assistance with the Pasta Dinner came quickly from Simon's Maplewood Lane neighbors, his middle school football teammates, his fellow Boy Scouts from St. Rita's and his karate class at the Bay View Y (which, under the guidance of Council Member Justin Tubiolo, hosted a fundraiser of its own over the summer) as word of the Council's event spread through the community.

Co-Chairmen Joe Aschenbrenner and Mike Hosenfeld's Committee hit the ground running, each member contributing a talent of their own. Margie Richardson, a neighbor of the

Harris and the daughter of Marge and the late Ken Waehner, long-time *Compass* Editor, with a big assist from Allison and Mark Neumann, organized a search for donations for raffle gifts. That was successful beyond anyone's wildest dreams: over 100 donations came from businesses and individuals, most of which were acquired by the neighbors (Some of the gifts were valued at over \$1,000.00. leading to a separate silent auction.) Donating a basket were Margie's Mom, Marge, and sister, Mary Waehner.

Other members of the Committee – Dave Schaertel, Mike Donovan, Joann and Don Fisher, Andy Weidman, Walt Kowalski, Art Manning, Bob Leschhorn, Dave Samuelson and Dave McCoy -handled other duties, including volunteer coordination, solicitation of food donations, ticket sales, publicity, and food preparation. Plus, the incomparable McCoy got to play Maitre d' at the Dinner despite near exhaustion from a Scout overnight in Niagara Falls ending that morning. Not to worry, though: McCoy was teamed with a real Maitre d', Joe Rizzo, who seated everyone with a dazzling smile. Without minimizing the countless hours put in by all on the Committee, we would be remiss if we did not mention that the Fishers and Manning spent the better part of two days preparing the pasta and sauce, a la the late Joe Obbie in Pasta Dinners of yore.

Costs were kept to a minimum as virtually all of the food was donated by the likes of Barilla, Palmer's Food Service, Hege-dorn's, Wegmans – Holt Road,

Ken's Salad Dressings, Burger King, Brother Chris Joy's Comb and Razor (coffee – honest!) and even Manning's Computer Medics of Webster (to ensure that the spices used in the sauce were kept secret from even the committee members). Bartenders Roger Ellender, George Yohonn and Bud Shura donated their services, as did caterer Jason DeLeo and his staff.

From parking to table service, everything went smoothly on the appointed Sunday. Over 600 dinners were served in short order, thanks to the efficient food preparation and number of volunteers (over 100) available to assist on the floor serving, cleaning up, selling 50/50 and raffle tickets. No long lines materialized at the ticket table either, as Kowalski and his crew kept everybody moving crisply.

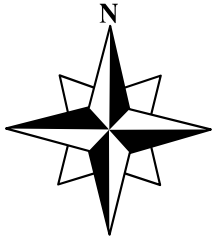
