

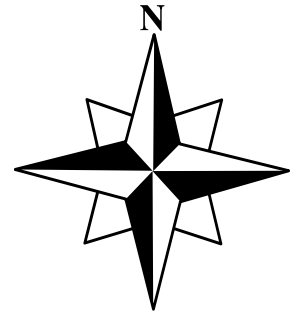

Grand Knight's Message
ORGANIZATION OF THE
KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

This is a long column this month. Ever since I became a Knight I have wondered about the structure of the K of C and in particular I've wondered where our Finger Lakes Chapter fits into the hierarchy. Additionally, I've wondered about what it meant that our general meetings are opened in the First Section. Here are the answers to these questions. Thanks to PGK and current Director of Communications for NYS Tom Freundsuh for help with this. This material is written for inclusion in the upcoming *New members Handbook*. You can find more detail there.

The Knights of Columbus are governed by the Supreme Council which is located in New Haven, CT. The next level is the state, provincial and other international and global regional levels, then districts, and finally into the various councils.

The following official schematic structure exists for the Knights of Columbus:

Additional Structure:

New York State and some other larger states contain an "unofficial" governance substructure of Chapters and/or Conferences. Trinity Council is within the Finger Lakes Chapter which consists of all of the 43 councils in the Rochester Diocese. Other Chapters may include parts of a neighboring diocese or subset of a diocese. The objectives of the Finger Lakes Chapter are:

To serve as the Service Organization and the medium for the exchange of ideas and measures for the benefit of the Order and the Councils within the Diocese of Rochester, New York, and any Councils that border the Diocese of Rochester.

To foster, support and promote Vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life through prayers, works, and monetary donations to those who are studying at all levels of college and post-graduate.

To exemplify among its members the principles of the Order: Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism.

To promote Catholic Action and Catholic Education

To foster and promote recommended programs for Catholic Youth.

Each Chapter is also a Conference and the member population of each Chapter and Conference is one in the same. That is, every member of a particular chapter is also a member of that particular conference. Thus, every chapter representative who is a member of the Finger Lakes Chapter is also a member of the Finger Lakes Conference. Furthermore, only members of a particular chapter are members/can be members of that corresponding conference. The representational body for the Finger Lakes Chapter would/could be comprised of 43 GKs, 86 delegates and between 9 and 12 DDs. Thus, the representational body for the Finger Lakes Chapter would be comprised of up to 140 members. Chapter meetings are held five times a year throughout the Chapter catchment region.

The primary role of the conferences is to nominate individuals for state office and to consider other K of C internal political (nomination related) matters. Candidates for State Office are chosen by the conferences, which nominate individuals from each of the major conferences on an equitable basis, and these positions are rotated throughout the three state regions in an orderly way. The conferences have no administrative or executive function.

The three Major New York State Conferences and Chapters are: Upstate, Downstate and Long Island.

The Upstate Major Conference/Chapter is comprised of the following minor conferences:

- Western Conference
- Central Conference
- Finger Lakes Conference
- Northern Conference

Since this document is concerned with our Finger Lakes Chapter/Conference, we will only delineate the components of the Finger Lakes Conference which is comprised of the following counties: which in turn comprise the Diocese of Rochester, and thus the Finger Lakes Chapter:

Meetings of the First Section

Local Council General Meetings are opened in the First Section. This means that only individuals who hold the First Degree or higher are permitted to enter the meeting chambers and take part in the general meetings of the council.

Each council member receives a membership card indicating degree status. The membership card is also known as the "Traveling Card" which entitles him to enter the meeting chambers of any K of C Council for the purposes of attending a general meeting or other activities of a council that requires membership of the First Degree.

Meetings of the Third Section

Council officers meetings, chapter meetings and conference and higher-level meetings are open only to Knights holding the Third Degree or higher. As such, these meetings are opened in the Third Section. There are no meetings that are designated as being opened in the Second Section.

Meetings of the Fourth Section

These meetings are restricted to members holding the Fourth Degree membership card and are usually meetings of the Fourth Degree Assemblies or activities of one or more assemblies.

So, now my questions about structure have been answered. It seems a good way to start the New Year.

Here is wishing everyone a happy, prosperous and HEALTHY 2011.

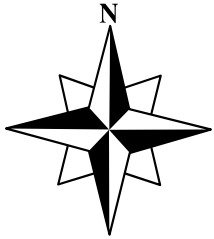
