

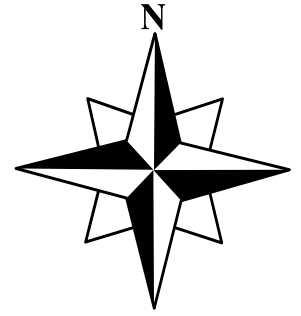

117th Annual NYS Council Convention Report

New York State Council's theme for this past Columbian Year “Building His Dream, which honors our Order's founder, the Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney, was the main focus of events as fellow Knights and Ladies representing their Councils traveled to the Westchester Marriott in Tarrytown for the 117th Annual New York State Council Knights of Columbus Convention May 3rd through May 5th, 2012.

The first day's events began with Convention Delegate registration and then a 5:30 PM Mass celebrated by Associate State Chaplain Father Brian McWeeney. Following Mass dinner was served in the hotel's Grand Ball Room. As dinner began, our State Deputy Sal Restivo handed out “Building His Dream” awards to several Knights in attendance whose hard work throughout this past year “stood out above the rest”. Among those receiving awards was Fr. Brian McWeeney for his wonderful work in serving the State Council. Thomas Tedone from Corning Council #281 was given an award for his exemplary work as Membership Coordinator for the Finger Lakes Conference. Deacon Kevin McCormack was saluted for excellence as a Catholic Educator at Xaverian High School in Brooklyn. The State Council made a \$1,000 donation to the school in his name.

After dinner many high level meetings were conducted by

the State Deputy and his staff and committees while the rest of the delegates (including yours truly) enjoyed an evening of camaraderie in the hospitality rooms sponsored by the various minor conferences. As many of my fellow Trinity Council Brother Knights who have attended conventions in the past can attest to this, excursions to these rooms can be quite “interesting,” to say the least. I have to admit this year was no exception to that rule. A fellow Knight (from the NYC area) and I were talking. He said “you look like a famous actor/director.” This, of course, had me a bit puzzled. Then he said “Quentin Tarantino”. Well, being the skeptic that I am, I pulled out my smart phone and I looked it up. After perusing said actor/director photos I conceded that, with dark glasses and my hair combed just right, the possibility existed and we both had a good laugh.

Being that the next day's events would start early I then retired to my room which I shared with fellow delegate Tony Liccione PGK (kiddingly known as “Uncle Louie”) from Rochester Council 178. We both discussed the day's events and his drive up with the other delegates (Gary & Jack Fouquet) from his Council and then retired for the evening.

Day two began with Mass followed by breakfast during which I shared good fellowship with the many fellow delegates and their spouses from the Finger Lakes area. Then it was off to

start a very busy day of meetings. The opening session featured video messages from Pope Benedict XVI thanking the Knights of Columbus for the important work that we do, and Supreme Chaplain Bishop William Lori, Archbishop of Baltimore, and Supreme Knight Carl Anderson emphasizing the importance of "protecting our religious liberties". Father McWeeny then spoke, echoing the sentiments of the Supreme Chaplain & Supreme Knight, as well as the importance of the role of the Council Chaplain and making him feel involved in the Council. Past State Deputy Art Harris, who is now serving as a Supreme Director, spoke on a myriad of topics including the defense of our religious liberties, membership, service programs, insurance & ceremonials. One of the service programs he mentioned was the ultrasound programs being set up around the state including the one right here in the Rochester area that is being organized through the hard work of our own DGK, Dean Hamingson.

State Deputy Restivo then gave his annual State of the State Council report. The main topics of his report were addressing State Council finances and the fiscal policies and the further use of electronic communications to cut down on travel expenses and to help promote our Order's message. Sal also spoke on the Prayer Rally, Youth Involvement, Membership, Programs, C & B, Catholic Education, and encouraged Councils to bring their Chaplain to the next State Convention.

The annual report of the Charities Inc. Corporation was then

presented.. As part of this report a video of the St. Mary's Healthcare System for Children in New York City and the important work they do was shown. State Deputy Restivo then presented a \$10,000 check on behalf of the State Council to Angela Scutti from St. Mary's to help further their good works.

Several reports were made by State Advocate Mike Stephany from Caledonia and other State Officers, including the various State program chairmen. The morning session was then adjourned, and delegates enjoyed a wonderful lunch.

The afternoon session began with the awards presentations. Our own Thomas Freundsuh in his capacity as State Chairman - Council Bulletins Contest presented the awards to Councils who submitted entries for judging. Awards were also handed out for the insurance agents program, youth, and council programs.

The final awards of the afternoon were handed out for the C & B program. I am very happy to report that "Trinity Council" won the 2011 Total Sales Category Leader Award for Councils with Members 251-300 members with 444 books sold. A big round of thanks goes to our Council Chairman PGK Joe Dilal for his hard work in winning this award!

The rest of the afternoon was spent attending meetings for the Finger Lakes Minor & Upstate Major Conferences. The main order of business at these meetings was discussing the resolutions and proposed state by-laws changes that

would be coming up for a vote at the Saturday morning business session. Many Past Grand Knights from Trinity Council, area dignitaries, as well as other members from the council were present to support those taking their degree.

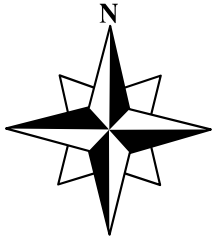

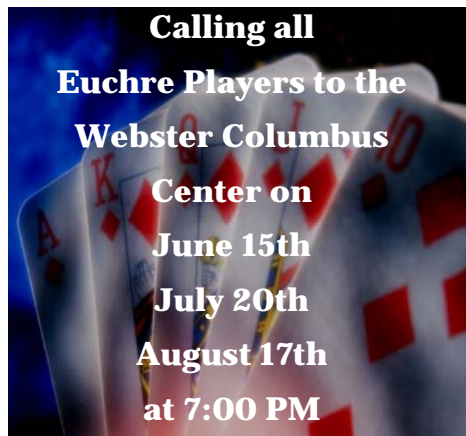
