

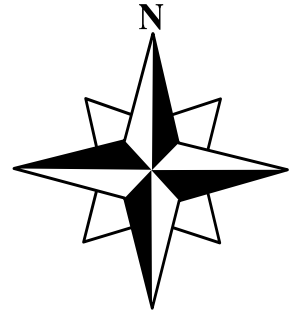

I was reminded also at the funeral that I want to live life in a manner that never beseches me to regret something and that there maybe some truth to the saying "Live life to the fullest". Considering the circumstances surrounding some of our losses last week, living life to the fullest, will present its challenges along the way. It more than likely will even have us take a timeout for awhile. Yet be all and end all, with God on our side and faith in our pockets, we will be able to continue this journey

to live life to the fullest. It will make those challenges, those time outs, just bumps in the road.

Trinity Council extends it's condolences to the families of Ray and Kathy Garbach, DGK Steve Tedesco, Marc Nelson, Mike Amico, Brendan Hanna and Tom Hanna. We pray that God gives you comfort, Jesus, His hand of love and the spirit of faith with the Holy Spirit. From the Solemn Blessing of the Mass for All Souls "As you believe that Jesus rose from the dead, so may you live with Him for ever in joy."

Both Phil and Dan served on the Board of Directors for over 20 years, which included Brother

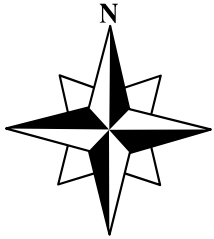


*Awardee Dan Milner and GK Tom Freundschuh posing for another camera at the February 6th membership meeting.*
