



## Grand Knight's Message

Our Knights of Columbus Webster Council's 46th Annual Charity Dinner was held Saturday, April 23<sup>rd</sup>. Over the years we have supported many charitable organizations that support a wide range of members of our community. Most recently, we have supported food cupboards, victims of abuse, refugees learning English, and those who suffered tragic events.

This year we were honored to support Flower City Pickers. Flower City Pickers started in 2015. Their goal is to collect and distribute left over produce from the Rochester Public Market to area food cupboards, half-way houses and other organizations in need of food. Every Saturday they collect and sort the left over produce. The food collected that is unusable is composted for animal feed so nothing is wasted.

Flower City Pickers demonstrates the Knights of Columbus four core principles: charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism. Charity: Jesus taught us to "Love thy neighbor as thyself". Like the Knights of Columbus, Flower City Pickers started from humble beginnings to provide for those in need. Our Deputy Grand Knight Dave McCoy has said many times in response to questions of what our council does is "we raise money and give it away". The experience of helping those in need is the heart of our values.

Unity: Unity is the second principle of the Knights of Columbus. Because

of this principle our council as a whole is much more than the sum of its parts. Khoury Humphrey, the founder of Flower City Pickers, realized early on that he could accomplish more collectively than individually. Flower City Pickers with Khoury and the board of trustees has stepped up to become a charity we can support. Our support of them will hopefully move them further down that path to make a better life for those in our community.

Fraternity: Reverend Michael J. McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus to support widows and orphans. Although insurance companies existed back in the late 1800's most insurance was not available to common people especially the victims of discrimination. So the Knights established their own insurance company to aid people when tragic events occurred. By providing support to today's societal casualties Flower City Pickers fits within this important principle.

Patriotism: Our country was founded by those who were oppressed in their home countries. We have built up a diverse population and although there are societal problems we, especially as Knights of Columbus, stand up for our country. It is not only charitable but it is patriotic to stand up for our fellow citizens in need. Flower City Pickers manifests Patriotism also by using every ounce of left over produce for our community and animal friends.





## Short Stuff: Here are some things to think about.

### Leave No Man Standing

If you see a man standing alone during cocktails whom you don't know, think about going over, introducing yourself and asking a few questions of him. Where does or did he work? ### Consider the Microphone

In one of these columns, we spoke about the inverse square law and how rapidly sound drops off as a function of distance. I should have added something about the directionality of speech which can be very highly directional in some instances. Keep in mind that hearing loss is the most invisible of handicaps, and although it can't be seen there is very good reason to believe that 25% or more of the people at our meetings have trouble hearing to some extent - even with their hearing aids. Please consider using the microphone when addressing the group so that all can hear what you have to say. Or, better yet, I wonder if there is a possibility of a second microphone to be used from the floor? If we don't have one, perhaps it might not be a bad idea to get one.

### Membership Trivia

The other day, Dave Uerz and I wondered how many dues paying members we have. Turns out to be a

simple question with a complex answer. Dave asked FS Bob McNeill. His response:

*"Currently we have 207 billable members. . . . but this is reduced by the number of 'Deacons', [and other] folks we've designated [as] 'Service Gratuitous or Council Hardship or ', etc., to arrive at the number that the Council actually bills.*

*If you were interested in knowing how much we should take in from dues, well, that's more complicated. We have several different dues rates: regular @ \$50, and honorary @ \$10, a couple of folks we grandfathered under the "retired" category @ \$25, one student @ \$25, etc."*

It appears that "dues paying members" is not a straight forward concept. To complicate matters further, it appears we have a grand total of 352 members if we count Honorary Life Members, and "Insurance Only Members" who are not required to pay dues and have no other required responsibilities towards the Council. Can't imagine many will find this information useful, but it is interesting isn't it?

## Insurance News *Don't Assume You Can't Afford Disability Income Insurance #*

A great and deserved touch was added to the evening when PGK Dave called up those who help financially supplement the donation total (See picture on next page). The highlight of the evening.....







